

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

Departments at the Polytechnic of Rijeka


At the Polytechnic classes are held within 9 undergraduate professional study programmes and 5 specialist graduate professional study programmes. These are structured and run within 4 departments and two independent study programmes:

- Transport Department
- Business Department
- Occupational Safety Department
- Agricultural Department
- Telematics
- Sustainable Agritourism

The majority of study programmes are carried out at the Polytechnic of Rijeka headquarters and partly at locations in Poreč and Pazin.



What can I study at the Polytechnic of Rijeka?



The Polytechnic of Rijeka offers potential students interesting study programmes at two levels of professional study programmes: first (undergraduate) and second (graduate) level.

All study programmes have been modernized and are in accordance with the demands of the Bologna process. The implementation of the majority of modernized study programmes began in the academic year 2005/2006.

All programmes are carried out for full-time and part-time students and are, thus, available even to those students who are employed and study and work at the same time or cannot attend classes due to some other reasons.

The majority of study programmes are carried out at the Polytechnic of Rijeka headquarters at Vukovarska 58, Rijeka. In order to bring college education as close as possible to their home, for students who live outside Rijeka, the Polytechnic runs some of its study programmes at other locations - in Pazin and Poreč. Moreover, the study programmes of Winemaking and Mediterranean Agriculture are carried out in Poreč due to specific conditions demanded by the programmes.

- candidates who finished four-year high school before 2010 apply to the Polytechnic
 of Rijeka in accordance with the regulations of the application to enrol in the firstyear part-time study programme, which will be published on the website
 www.veleri.hr.

The requirements to enrol in specialist graduate professional study programmes:

 people who completed their three-year undergraduate professional study programmes or university undergraduate study programmes and met the requirements of admission to first year specialist graduate study programmes, which is published by the Polytechnicof Rijeka, are eligible to apply for specialist graduate professional study programme.

Business Department

A demanding business environment encouraged the development of suitable study programmes, which are carried out at the Business Department.

Today there are two first-level programmes and two second-level programmes at the Business Department. The undergraduate study programmes are carried out for three years. The sixth semester is reserved for internship and preparation of final professional thesis. The graduate study programmes are carried out for two years. The classes are taken during the first three semesters and in the fourth semester students undergo on-the-job training and write a specialist thesis.

After completing the undergraduate professional study programmes of Information Science and Entrepreneurship, students are trained to begin their professional career.

After finishing these two undergraduate professional study programmes and gaining 180 ECTS credits, students obtain one of the following professional titles:

- Professional Bachelor of Economics
- Professional Bachelor of Information Science

Students who obtained one of the above-mentioned professional titles at the Polytechnic of Rijeka or at some other institution of higher education, can enrol into a suitable higher level study programme. At the end of the programme and by obtaining 300 ECTS credits (180 + 120 ECTScredits) students obtain one of the following professional titles:

- Professional Specialist of Entrepreneurship
- Professional Specialist of Information
 Science and Technology in Business Systems

All study programmes of the Business Department have been carried out as full-time and part-time in Rijeka since the academic year 2007/2008. The undergraduate professional study programme of Entrepreneurship is carried out for full-time and part-time students in Pazin as well.

Business Department Programmes - the Structure of Professional Study Programmes

The undergraduate professional study programme of Information Science aims at training experts to master complex technical tasks of designing, programming, implementing and maintaining information systems and data bases, introducing and using information systems and networks. By fulfilling the requirements of the undergraduate professional study programme at the Business Department, students obtain 180 ECTS credits.

The undergraduate professional study programme of Entrepreneurship aims at training experts to act as entrepreneurs and gain knowledge and skills in doing business as entrepreneurs. The specific objective is to enable students to analyse business opportunities and other subjects in a dynamic environment.

The specialist graduate professional study programme of Information Science and Technology in Business Systems aims at training professionals to master complex tasks in the area of applied information science. The Specialist Graduate Professional Study Programme of Information Science and Technology in Business Systems has two tracks, and these are:

- Software Engineering for Enterprises
- Business Information Systems

The specialist graduate professional study programme of Entrepreneurship aims at training experts for mastering complex specialized professional tasks in the field of entrepreneurship and business systems management.





Transport Department

The Transport Department of the Polytechnic of Rijeka carries out two first-level study programmes and one second-level study programme.

By completing the undergraduate professional study programmes of Road and RailroadTransport, students are trained to begin their professional career.

By finishing these two undergraduate study programmes and obtaining 180 ECTS credits, students gain the professional title:

Professional Bachelor of Transport Engineering

Students can also obtain second-level training by enrolling into the specialist graduateprofessional study programme of Transport at the Polytechnic of Rijeka.

By completing the specialist graduate professional study programme of Transport and obtaining 300 ECTS credits (180 + 120 ECTS credits), students receive the professional title:

Professional Specialist of Transport Engineering

All the study programmes are carried out at the Polytechnic of Rijeka headquarters as full-timeand part-time programmes.

Transport Department Programmes - the Structure of Professional Study Programmes

The undergraduate professional study programme of Road Transport - aims at training expertsfor conducting complex operative tasks of designing projects and assignments such as planning the preparation, improvement and control of technological and service processes in the area of road transport.

The undergraduate professional study programme of Railroad Transport - aims at training experts in railroad transport to work on performing complex operative tasks in the area of transport, applying professional knowledge and skills while dealing with techniques, technology and security of railroad transport.

The specialist graduate professional study programme of Transport with areas of specialization in road, railroad and postal services has the objective basic of providing theoretical and professional training of a certain number of specialists in managing transport economy in order to achieve optimal technological and economic effects accompanied with high level of environment protection.

Occupational Safety Department

The Occupational Safety Department of the Polytechnic of Rijeka carries out one first-level study programme and one second-level study programme.

Upon completion of the undergraduate professional study programme of Occupational Safety, students are qualified to begin their professional career in their work environment.

By meeting the requirements of the undergraduate professional study programme of Occupational Safety and gaining 180 ECTS credits, students obtain the professional title:

Professional Bachelor of Safety and Protection Engineering

The students who gained the abovementioned professional title at the Polytechnic of Rijeka or some other institution of higher education can enrol in the study programme that provides a higher level of training and which is carried out by Occupational Safety Department. By completing this study programme and gaining the total amount of 300 ECTS credits (180 + 120 ECTS credits), students obtain the title:

 Professional Specialist Engineer of Safety and Protection

All programmes of the Occupational Safety Department are carried out as full-time and part-time the Polytechnic of Rijeka headquarters.

Occupational Safety Department Programmes - the Structure of Study Programmes

The undergraduate professional study programme of Occupational Safety offers the following tracks:

- 1. Occupational Safety in Industry
- 2. Fire Protection
- 3. General Safety

During the first two years of the study programme, students gain fundamental knowledge from the area of Occupational Safety and in the third year they decide on one of the tracks by enrolling into a group of courses which are characterized by specific content of the track. The classes are taken during the first five semesters, and in the sixth semester students undergo on-the-job training and write a final thesis

The specialist graduate professional study programme of Occupational Safety offers the following tracks:

- 1. Occupational Safety in Industry
- 2. Fire Protection
- 3. General Safety

Upon completion of their studies, students will be able to analyse company policies from the aspect of occupational safety, and work on improving the system of occupational safety and fire protection. The study programme is carried out for two years. The classes are taken during the first three semesters and in the fourth semester students undergo on-the-job training and write aspecialist thesis.

In the second year, students choose their track and hence adjust the study programme to their goals and needs of future employment.

Agricultural Department

The Polytechnic of Rijeka carries out at the Agricultural Department, which is in Poreč, study programmes in the biotechnical field. The Department offers two first-level and one second-level study programme.

By meeting the requirements of the undergraduate professional study programme of Winemaking and Mediterranean Agriculture, students are qualified to start off with their professional careers.

By fulfilling the requirements of the undergraduate professional study programme of the Agricultural Department and gaining 180 ECTS credits, students obtain one of the following professional titles:

- Professional Bachelor of Enology
- Professional Bachelor of Mediterranean Agriculture

Also, students can obtain higher levels of training by enrolling into the specialist graduate professional study programme of Winemaking.

By meeting the requirements of the specialist graduate professional study programme of Winemaking and gaining the total amount of 300 ECTS credits (180 + 120 ECTS credits), students obtain the professional title:

Professional Specialist of Winemaking

Study programmes of the Agricultural Department are run as full-time and parttime in Poreč.

Agricultural Department Programmes - the Structure of Professional Study Programmes

The undergraduate professional study programme of Winemaking aims at training experts to manage agricultural estates, especially in the area of wine production with the goal of achieving optimal effects and preserving natural resources at the same time. The study programme provides the necessary theoretical knowledge and by receiving on-the-job training during education, the student masters the techniques and technology of producing grapesand wine, as well as the principles of managing agricultural estates.

The undergraduate professional study programme of Mediterranean Agriculture aims at training experts for complete management of agricultural estates in Mediterranean climate conditions. The gained knowledge ensures flexibility in different technological and business situations and the successful management of family farms in terms of small and middle-sized companies in the Mediterranean basin in conditions of rapid technology development.

The specialist graduate professional study programme of Winemaking ensures knowledge to enter business processes successfully and provides specific theoretical and practical knowledge to acquire new technologies and knowledge and develops moral and ethical principles in terms of product quality, environment protection and preservation of natural resources. The study programme is adjusted to the needs of agroindustry with a focus on creating an expert in the wine production process, special wines and other grape andwine products, with all professional and moral characteristics, which are necessary for such anoble profession.

Telematics Study Programme

The synonym for telematics is also ICT which stands for Information and Communication Technology. Telematics as modern integrating technology, which integrates telecommunication an IT, contributes to a more dynamic economy.

With respect to ICT, the emphasis of the study programme is on developing a hardware and software base to provide information services of higher level, whose design and implementation is in the focus of interest of our professional and specialist study programme of Information Science.


Since familiarity with the equipment and hardware is essential for every engineer, the undergraduate professional study programme of Telematics pays special attention to hands-on experience with the equipment in our laboratory. In the laboratory students (besides getting familiar with the basics of electrical engineering, electronics and measurement) have a possibility to work in small groups and relaxed atmosphere with network switches (Cisco, D-link, Planet), routers, servers, industrial computers and modern industrial processes, in their own computer network, optical fiber and carbon fiber network cables, devices for permanent supply, robots (Lego, Mindstorms, Velleman), development platforms such as Arduino, Raspberry Pi, BeagleBoard, PLC-s (Siemens), RTU-s (Moxxa) and the equipment to simulate optical networks.



Besides the laboratory, students are familiarized with the development of mobile applications, webpages, and a series of other parts of programming knowledge on practical projects and independent tasks. The student who is at the end of the study programme can enclose in his/her CV a list of projects on which he/she has worked on and showed enthusiasm during the programme, which guarantees advantage in the labour market.



The programme of the Professional Undergraduate Study Programme of Telematics is carried out as full-time and part-time in Rijeka.

By fulfilling all requirements of the study programme, students achieve 180 ECTS credits and obtain the professional title:

Professional Bachelor of Telematics Engineering

Students who meet the requirements of the three year undergraduate professional study programme of Telematics can even continue their education at the Polytechnic of Rijeka and compete directly to enrol into the Specialist Graduate Professional Study Programme of Information Science and Technology in Business Enterprises.

Sustainable Agritourism Study Programme

The undergraduate professional study programme of Sustainable Agritourism was developed based on the data obtained from market research, primarily from surveys filled out bypotential employers about the key work activities as well as the knowledge and skills required in agritourism.

Theoretical knowledge and practical skills necessary for quick inclusion into the labour market are acquired during the study programme. Upon graduation, there is an option of self-employment or employment with businesses working in the agritourism industry.

The study programme is organized as a full-time and part-time study programme. It is divided into six semesters and it lasts three years. In the summer semester of each academic year, students have a professional internship, and they complete the study by writing and defending their final professional thesis. All curricula are scored according to the ECTS system. Each course each semester gives a student 30 ECTS credits, so that by the end of the study programme he/she has to acquire the total of 180 ECTS credits.

The central library with the highest number of books, a reading room and reference collections with open and closed access, is equipped with 16 computers for learning, writing thesis and accessing on-line databases and journals to which the Library is subscribed. The Library catalogue of the Polytechnic offers students the information about the books and available literature and the information is available by the service "ask librarians" via the library webpage.

The library catalogue is by its content and size adjusted to scientific-research programme of the activities at the Polytechnic of Rijeka.

Individual and group workshops are organized in the library in terms of training to use library services and improving IT literacy, which are focused on students (users).



International Cooperation

The Polytechnic of Rijeka has recognized the importance of internationalization of higher education and, therefore, it carries out the following activities:

- developing international cooperation with partner institutions in Europe and the world
- encouraging mobility of students, teachers, and non-teaching staff (Erasmus+ and CEEPUS programmes).



The European Commission has awarded the "Erasmus Charter for Higher Education 2021–2027" certificate to the Polytechnic of Rijeka, which will enable the Polytechnic to participate in the activities of the Erasmus+ programme in the next period.

To enable a higher quality of college education, work and training for teaching and non-teaching staff, the Polytechnic of Rijeka entered the Erasmus mobility programme in 2009. The Erasmus programme enables students, teaching and non-teaching staff of the Polytechnic of Rijeka to visit one of the countries members of the European Union to learn, teach or attend professional training.

The exchange of teaching and non-teaching staff ensures multiple positive outcomes, for instance, the Erasmus+ programme served as a basis for developing new study programmes. The Polytechnic of Rijeka in cooperation with its bilateral partner from Germany, TH Wildau from Berlin, developed and founded the undergraduate professional study programme of Telematics.

The Polytechnic of Rijeka has signed more than forty Erasmus Bilateral Agreements with partners from 15 European countries:

Useful information for international students

CROATIAN TAX NUMBER

Students have to apply for the personal identification number - **Croatian tax number (OIB)** at the Tax Department. They need to fill in the form which they will receive there and bring the original and a copy of their passport. The Tax Department will issue the OIB number the same day.

X-CARD

OIB is a precondition for a **student identity card (x-card)**. X-card **proves a student status** and may also be used to get a discount for some tickets and services. It enables students to eat in students' cafeterias and restaurants at a reduced price.

After they are officially enrolled at the Polytechnic of Rijeka, students receive their personal credentials. These normally correspond to: username=name.surname and password. Personal credentials give access to the online services for students (e.g. e-learning platforms, free wi-fi in Polytechnic building or in Dormitory).

EXTENSION OF THE EXCHANGE PERIOD

Students who want to extend their mobility period at the Polytechnic of Rijeka have to be authorized by both the International Cooperation Office at Polytechnic of Rijeka and by their home University.

Extension requests are mandatory to be able to take exams after the official ending of the Erasmus/International mobility period (beyond the number of months confirmed in the students' online application).

CLOSING OF THE ERASMUS AND/OR INTERNATIONAL MOBILITY PERIOD

The closing of the mobility period is MANDATORY! At the end of their exchange period, before leaving, students MUST go to the International Cooperation Office to close their mobility period. They have to bring any final documents of their home University that they need to have signed/stamped by our Polytechnic.

Closing the mobility period is a compulsory step in order to receive the Transcript of Records, which is the final document of the exchange study period certifying the beginning and ending dates of the mobility period and all the exams taken at Polytechnic of Rijeka.

Transcript of Records will be sent to the students' home University by email within 5 weeks after the exchange period.

IMPORTANT: the ending date of the mobility period will be the day when students go to the International Cooperation Office.

In case of any particular problem, students can refer to the Erasmus coordinator, a Vice dean for international cooperation or to the international cooperation delegates of each Department.

TEACHING AND EVALUATION

Teaching for foreign students is carried out in the form of consultancy with professors of the chosen course. Where and when is possible, international students are involved in teaching with domestic students (e.g. English language, Physical education, practical work...).

The final assessment of the attended courses is usually in the form of a written and oral exam (mostly taken at the end of the semester) and based on a performance recorded during the semester.


The Journal has been published regularly since 2013, once a year.





Rijeka's Beginnings

The oldest traces of human presence in today's Rijeka area date back to the Palaeolithic and Neolithic periods, and the remnants of prehistoric castles (Solin above Martinšćica, Trsatski brijeg and Veli vrh — Gradišće above the Rječina River) to the Bronze and Iron Ages. Flumen Sancti Viti — St. Vitus's Rijeka The development of Rijeka impelled the newly arrived Slavic settlers — the Croats — to conquer Tarsatica and start building a new settlement.



The turbulent 20th century

During the civil revolution of 1848, the city was annexed to the Banovina of Croatia, and the governor Josip Jelačić became governor of Rijeka. The fight over Rijeka between Croatia and Hungary was intensifying until the Croatian-Hungarian Treaty, the so called "Riječka krpica".

At the turn of the century

This expansive social and economic development also increased the number of inhabitants. Today, Rijeka and its surroundings have approximately 200.000 inhabitants. Simultaneously with its industrial development, Rijeka became the centre of western Croatia.



KORZO

Rijeka is reflected in Korzo, at Korzo you can read Rijeka. Anyone who, at least once, had a coffee at one of the terraces of numerous and picturesque café bars lined along this unusual promenade, would agree.



TRSAT CASTLE

Trsat Castle represents a strategically embossed gazebo on a hill 138 meters above sea level that dominates Rijeka.



ST. VITUS' CATHEDRAL

Rijeka's St. Vitus Cathedral is the only Baroque rotunda of monumental dimensions built on Croatian land.

CITY TOWER

City Tower, a symbol of Rijeka, is a good example of a typical round tower access-point, which lead into the fortified town.





CITY MARKET

The main city market was built at the end of the 19th century by the seashore.

SHRINE OF OUR LADY OF TRSAT AND THE TRSAT FRANCISCIAN MONASTERY

The Shrine of Our Lady of Trsat is the largest centre of pilgrimage in western Croatia.

IVAN KOBLER SQUARE

Passing under the round City Tower, the former main medieval town entrance that gave access to the coast, you enter the centre of Rijeka's Old Town.

Croatian language course

The Rijeka School of Croatian Studies (Faculty of Arts and Sciences, University in Rijeka) promotes the Croatian language, literature and culture internationally, develops modern methods of teaching Croatian as a second or a foreign language, promotes mobility and organises testing of knowledge of Croatian as a second or a foreign language.

The Rijeka School of Croatian Studies Croatian organizes Croatian language courses (beginner, intermediate and advanced level) for incoming mobility students. Health insurance

All foreign students must have health insurance during their stay in Croatia. The best option is to enrol in an insurance plan in the home country that covers one's stay in Croatia. They may use international health insurance from their home country or choose to be insured at the health insurance company of their choice.

EU citizens and citizens of Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland may apply for the European Health Insurance Card (or EHIC) at the health service institute in their own country, before departure for Croatia. It allows anyone who is insured by or covered by a statutory social security scheme of the EU to receive medical treatment in another member state for free or at a reduced cost if that treatment becomes necessary during their visit. The EHIC is not an alternative to travel insurance. It will not cover any private medical healthcare. Therefore, it is advisable to have both, an EHIC and a valid private travel insurance policy.

Visa / residence permit

MOBILITY PERIOD LONGER THAN 90 DAYS (TEMPORARY STAY)

Exchange students staying in Croatia for a period longer than three months (90 days) need to regulate the **residence permit** (apply for the approval of the temporary stay for the purpose of studies).

EU citizens / **EEA** member state nationals / Swiss Confederation citizens should submit application for the issuance of the residence card within 90 days of their arrival in Croatia (no later than eight days after the expiry of the three months of their stay) at the Foreigners' Office, Central Police Station.

Non-EU citizens staying in Croatia for more than 90 days are obliged to apply for the approval of the temporary stay for the purpose of studies within 48 hours of their arrival.

MOBILITY PERIOD SHORTER THAN 90 DAYS (SHORT-TERM STAY)

EU / EEA / Swiss citizens are not obliged to apply for the approval for temporary stay or to register their address if they are staying in Croatia shorter than 90 days.

Non-EU citizens need to register their address within 48 hours upon their arrival in Croatia at the Foreigners' Office, Central Police Station if they are staying in private accommodation (rented apartment or similar). For the students who are staying at hotels or student dormitories the address is automatically registered (hotels and student dormitories register their foreign guests).

All the students accepted for an exchange at the Polytechnic of Rijeka will be given Acceptance letter needed for the regulation of their temporary residence permit upon their arrival to Rijeka! **VISA** A **visa** is required for students coming from non-EU countries. The list of countries whose nationals need a visa to enter Croatia and detailed information on visa regulation (contacts, procedures) can be found at the website of the Croatian Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs. The visa application must be submitted to the diplomatic mission or consulate of the Republic of Croatia in the foreign national's home country before arrival to Croatia. Any visa related costs are not covered by the scholarship grant. Student identity card Foreign students at the Polytechnic of Rijeka are entitled to hold a student identity card (X-card) during their stay. It enables them to eat is students' cafeterias and restaurants at a reduced price. It proves a student status and may also be used to get a discount for some tickets and services (if applicable). In order to obtain the X-card student must apply for the personal identification number (OIB in Croatian) at the Tax Department (Riva 10, Rijeka), fill in the form and bring the original and a copy of a passport. Student will receive his/her OIB number the same day. **Confirmation of stay** Polytechnic of Rijeka will issue a Transcript of records for each student at the end of semester in and Transcript of February/July. The report will be sent to the student email and to coordinator at home institution (if **Records** required) within 5 weeks after the exchange period. Closing the mobility period is a compulsory step in order to receive the Transcript of Records. At the end of their exchange period, before leaving, students MUST go to the International Cooperation Office to close their mobility period. They are required to return their X-card. Please note that a confirmation of stay will only be issued for the period of actual studies at the Polytechnic of Rijeka. The welcome day will be declared as their date of arrival, and the ending day will be the last day that student need to be present at the Polytechnic of Rijeka (last exam and closing the mobility period at the International Cooperation Office). Information for Students with disabilities are considered students with: incoming students and vision impairment, staff with physical, hearing impairment, mental or health-• motor disorders, related conditions multiple impairments, chronic diseases, mental health issues, • specific learning difficulties (dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscaluculia, ADHD) • other health conditions or difficulties which may affect the course of study, and that could be proven by appropriate documentation.
